DEVON SQUASH RACKETS ASSOCIATION
HON. SECRETARY' S REPORT FOR 2010-11

General

Last year I reported that we had hopes that there would be a new facility for squash and racketball in North Devon. The Westward Ho! Sports Centre, which would have included 3 squash courts, narrowly failed to get planning permission in February 2010 (on the chairman' s casting vote) and also failed to get planning permission in August 2010. On behalf of the Association I had written letters in support of this project. The organisers of the project appealed against the decision to refuse planning permission but unfortunately the appeal was turned down. This is bad news for the future of squash and racketball (as well as several other sports) in North Devon and our sympathies must go to the organisers who had put in a lot of time, effort and hard work into this project.

On the Association' s behalf, I attended the AGM and Council meetings of England Squash and Racketball in London in November 2010 and the Council meeting in Birmingham in June 2011. The main topics at these meeting have been the governance of ESR, composition of the Board of ESR and the recommendations of the Membership Working Group. It seems likely that County Associations will have the only votes at Council which will elect 5 Members and the Chairman to the Board (the management board of ESR) and which will ratify the appointment by the Board of 2 other members of the Board. It looks likely that ESR will change the method of affiliation of clubs. At present clubs are expected to pay a fee per court and to pay an individual membership fee for each playing member. The system proposed is to replace this with a fee per court and ask clubs to submit to ESR names and email addresses of members who will then have the ability to become ESR individual members at several levels.

In November 2010 I attended a meeting of the Devon Council for School Sport and I persuaded the Council to increase our grant from one unit to two. This past year we received a grant of £800 towards the cost of our junior teams and I am confident that we shall receive a similar grant in future years.

The Executive Committee met four times during the year in August and November 2010 and in February and May 2011. Regrettably there was also the meeting of the Disciplinary Committee which resulted in a player being banned from Devon SRA competitions for the season for his aggressive behaviour during and after a league match.

Last year saw the publication of "A History of Devon Squash" by Michael Tremellen . Copies of the book can still be obtained from myself - £5 including postage.

Racketball continues to expand in the County and this year saw the inclusion of the Racketball divisions onto our NineNil league management system and the introduction of a Racketball Masters Closed Championship. Our inter-county team became Champions, several Devon players have done well in regional and national championships and several of our Devon players are in the English ranking list. Devon and Exeter were runners-up in the National Clubs Championship.

Exeter Diamonds played in Group B of the Premier Squash League and, after being in contention for a spot in the semi-finals, eventually ended up 4th out of 6 teams. The team plays in front of packed houses at the Devon and Exeter Club and continues to bring squash of the highest standard to Devon.

James Snell and Mike Harris ran two Squash Academies for juniors and we hope that these can be continued and expanded so that a proper programme can be developed for junior development in the County.

League, Cup and Shield Competitions.

We had a full programme of League fixtures with 11 teams in the Ladies' League, 51 teams in the Mixed League and 9 teams in the Racketball League. In the Ladies' League we had 6 teams in Division 1 in which teams played each other once in each half and 5 teams in Division 2 in which teams played each other twice in each half. In the Mixed League we reverted to a Premier Division of 10 teams with the other divisions having 9, 10 or 11 teams with teams playing each other once in each half. In the Racketball League we had 5 teams in Division 1 in which teams played each other once in each half and 4 teams in Division 2 in which teams played each other twice in each half.

Congratulations should go to the Devon & Exeter Squash & Racketball Club who did the Double by winning the Cup and the Premier Division and whose teams managed to win 5 other divisions.

I am sure that we owe huge thanks to our two league secretaries, Alison Samuel and Alan Ford, for the skilled effort they have put in running the leagues, cup and shield competitions.

Inter-County Competitions

The Association entered 6 senior and 5 junior teams in the ESR Inter-County Championships and 4 junior teams in the South-West Junior League.

Seniors

The most successful team was our **Racketball** team led from the front by Matt Baker. Devon are County Champions! Having been promoted to Division 1 in their first season two years ago, last year they were runners-up in the Inter-County Championship losing by the narrowest of margins to Dorset in the final. This year they qualified for the finals by beating Sussex 3 - 2, beating Derbyshire 5 - 0 but losing to Dorset 1 - 4 in Stage 1. In the finals they beat Kent 4 - 1, beat Warwickshire 5 - 0 and in the final decisive match beat Dorset 3 - 2 with captain Matt Baker holding his nerve to win the deciding rubber by 12-10 in the fifth game. Congratulations to the team comprising James Snell, Jim Bristow, Matt Baker, Christian Turner, Mike Gregory, David Palmer, Ashley Knight, Gavin Perrett and Stuart Perrett.

Our **Men's Senior** team were almost as successful with four of the squad also being in the Racketball squad. Last year they were unlucky to be relegated from the Premier group, but this season they bounced back with a flourish beating all six counties they faced and gaining promotion to the Premier Group. In Stage 1 they beat Berkshire 5-0, beat Dorset 5 - 0 and beat Kent 3-2. In Stage 2 they beat Middlesex 4 - 1, beat Kent 5 - 0 and beat Cambridgeshire 4 - 1. Our **Men's over 45** team managed by Rob Brown had a very successful Stage 1 in which they beat Hampshire 4 - 1, beat Wiltshire 5 - 0 and beat Dorset 4 - 1. Our Junior teams have met with mixed success this season but what is most important that we run these teams so that our most promising juniors can get inter-county experience. The South West Junior League also gives an opportunity for juniors who may not get into inter-county competition teams to gain experience of match competition. The success of our under 11 team bodes well for the future. What is worrying is the lack of competition for girls. In recent years we have only run one inter-county girls' team and it likely that next year we shall not run any at all and our only teams for girls will be the mixed teams in the South West Junior League.

Sincere thanks are due to all the Captains, Managers and Coaches of our teams, and also to those unsung heroes, the parents of the junior players, for transporting their offspring around the country so cheerfully. All their efforts are much appreciated by the County Committee.

Special thanks are due to our retiring team managers: Ian Shannon who has run Junior Teams since 2003, David Mudge who has run Girls' teams since 2004 but who is taking over the over 55 Men' s team from Trevor Reece who has managed it since 2007.

Individual achievements

Tory Temple-Murray continues to be one of our most successful junior players. She is currently ranked No.1 at under 17 and No.3 at under 19 in England and No.1 at under 17 in Europe. Among her many successes is winning the under 17 Belgian Open, the under 17 French Open and the under 17 English Closed. She played for the England team that won the European Team Championships in Germany and was 5th in the under 19 European individual championships. She has been selected for England in the under 19 world championships in Boston in July and is travelling to Hong Kong in August to take part in the under 19 individual event. More locally she is the Devon Ladies Champion, the Devon under 19 Girls champion, played no 1 for the Devon Ladies team and more recently won the under 19 Competition at the Harrow Open at the Devon and Exeter.

Lyell Fuller won the Wycliffe Junior Open and the Finnish Junior Open at the under 15 level. He now competes at the under 17 level in which he has won the Hungarian Junior Open, the Scottish Open, the Exeter Junior Open, the Edgbaston Junior Open and also the under 19 South Marston Junior Open. He has played at No. 1 for Wycliffe College's under 15 and under 19 teams who are English Schools Champions. He also played at No.1 for the South West Area under 17 team. He is currently ranked No. 6 at under 17 and No.21 at under 19 in England.

Tom Lammonby who played at No.1 for our successful under 11 team won the under 11 events at the Harrow Junior Open and the Exeter Junior Open. He was placed 17th in the English under 11 Championships after taking the No.1 seed to 5 games in the 2nd round. He is currently ranked 25 in England.

Ben Ford won the under 13 event at the Exeter Junior Open and is currently ranked 43 in England.

Other Devon Juniors in the top 50 rankings in England are Jessica Mudge (No 22 at under 19) and Jack Newey (No.44 at under 11).

Tom Lammonby, Jack Newey, Ben Ford and Lyell Fuller were all members of South West Area teams which won Regional Junior Championship.

At the extreme senior level David Jones (D&E) played for the Welsh over 65 team in the Home International tournament.

At Racketball Matt Baker won his 4th Devon Championship, the Wolverhampton Open and the British over 35 Championship. With Jim Lord (Yorkshire) he won the British Doubles Championship beating Gavin Perrett and Mike Gregory in the final. Gavin gained some consolation in becoming Mixed Doubles Champion (with Lauren Selby). In the National Racketball Championships Lyn Smith was the runner-up in the over 55 Ladies, James Snell reached the quarter-finals in the Men's main event, Paul Smith won the over 50 Men's Plate and Paul Henderson won the over 55 Men's Plate. Five Devon players are in the top 50 of the England ranking list : - Matt Baker 6, James Snell 14, Gavin Perrett 25, Christian Turner 31 and Ben Sutton 40)

Finally may I thank all of those who help to keep Squash and Racketball running in Devon. I should like to thank our President Keith White, Chairman Paul Shewbrook, our League Secretaries, all our members of the Committee, tournament organisers, team managers and referees. THE DEVON JUNIOR & DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Main Aim

The Devon SRA appointed a County Development Committee in 1994 to enhance the awareness of the sport in Devon, to assist at all levels and standards of play where possible and to establish an easy rapport with all squash centers throughout the county.

Support for Junior sections

Devon County Association will work with clubs to encourage and support them as they encourage junior players.

Using the England Squash Club Charter Programme all clubs in Devon will be encouraged to meet at least the most basic criteria:

- One Level 2 Coach working at the club
- Promoting safe and effective practice (i.e. Child Protection Issues)
 - An active junior section to be within the club
 - Some links with local schools

Devon County Association will Provide

- A clear development pathway for talented juniors to benefit from county coaching, and representation in county squads if they are able.
 - Some funds (limited) to encourage people to become qualified as coaches, and support for them when they do become coaches.
 - Help and advice in the running of Open Days and Taster sessions to encourage new membership at the club.
 - A limited stock of start up equipment (to borrow) available to those clubs who wish to start a junior section or run a promotional event.
- Advice and support on England Squash initiatives such as junior skills awards, Mini Squash and running junior Graded Events.
 - Advice and support on accessing funding for squash sections.

Support for Junior Events

Devon County Association will run the following events to support developing juniors and emerging talent within the county :

- A Devon junior Inter Club League for set age groups
- Marking and refereeing courses for juniors and junior organisers
- An annual junior closed competition with separate age groups for boys and girls up to age under 19.

- Coaching for junior County Squads, and talent spotters ensuring that all talented children are picked up within Devon.
- County junior Teams in the South West Leagues and the National England Squash Inter County Championships.

Adult Development

Devon Squash will support those individuals who wish to become qualified as coaches referees and markers.

We will also continue to run the following events to support squash in the county:

- ? Senior County Closed
- ? Senior County Leagues – Ladies & Mixed.
- ? County Doubles
- ? Support various graded sanctioned events.

Contact and Communication from England Squash

Devon SRA will continue to communicate with its fellow members and clubs all development information that comes from the England Squash Head Office and Regional Office.

This will include membership information, workshop and training opportunities and initiatives such as 'Give Squash a Bash'.

Devon Squash Mixed League Rules

2011-2012

Amended rules for this season have been Underlined

1. Eligibility

1.1 CLUBS

(a) All clubs/teams must be paid-up members of England Squash. Clubs/teams will be suspended if membership subscriptions are still outstanding on October 31st.

(b) League entry fees will be determined by the Executive Committee and notified to the Annual General Meeting. Entry fees are due on September 1st. Teams who have not paid by September 30th and any club not providing England Squash by that date with the total amount due for Individual Membership for all their Registered League team players, will have 5 points deducted for every match played before October 31st. Teams who have not paid by October 31st will be liable for suspension for the rest of the season, at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

(c) Any affiliated Club NOT represented at the Annual General Meeting will be charged an administrative levy of £10 which will be added to the invoice for the League team fees of that club. Non-attendance at the AGM will mean that the club representative cannot receive the League Secretary's pack of match balls, scorecards etc which are handed out at the AGM to all League clubs thereby saving postage and delivery costs.

(d) Clubs/teams must appoint a Club Administrator as a point of contact for the League Secretary. They must provide the League Secretary with their e-mail address. They will be responsible for representing the club/teams affairs and will have a password allocated by the League Secretary. It is therefore essential that passwords are not divulged to others. The Club Administrator may delegate to a Club Captain, the inputting and verification of result cards and the addition of players to the club/teams Player Registration List. Should an Administrator wish to delegate this authority, they must provide the League Secretary with the Club Captains name and e-mail address in order that they can be allocated a password. It is the Club Administrator who remains ultimately responsible for the actions of their Club Captains.

1.2 PLAYERS

(a) Players must be fully paid-up members of the club/ organisation they represent.

(b) Players must have:

(i) their principal place of residence in Devon or within 10 miles of the boundary

or (ii) have been born in Devon

or (iii) be qualified to represent Devon in the current season in the Inter County event.

(c) No player having been nominated for and having played without prior nomination in a mixed league match for one club/organisation, may in that season play for any other club/organisation in a mixed league match, unless cleared to do so by the League Secretary. Such clearance will be given only in exceptional circumstances.

(d) Where a player's eligibility is in doubt, proof of eligibility must be provided by the club/organisation to the satisfaction of the League Secretary.

(e) Players must be fully paid up members of England Squash. The ' Club Administrator' is responsible for seeing that players meet this condition and that their Membership Number is input on the on-line Player Registration List.

(f) Non County (NC) players: Clubs are allowed to use 1 (NC) player per team in the Premier League. These players MUST be nominated to the team and the letters (NC) added after their name. A team may change its (NC) player at any time through the league secretary. These players MUST be unnominated, then opted out. The new player MUST then be nominated to the team. Any such players once withdrawn cannot be re-nominated throughout the season.

2. FACILITIES/ EQUIPMENT

(a) Two courts are required for each match where there are two or more courts.

(b) Home teams will provide adequate changing facilities and refreshments after the match.

- (c) Dunlop match balls must be purchased by clubs on a centralized purchase basis at 2 Doz. per team for each club to cover all home matches. Cost of balls for each team will be added to the invoice for county league affiliation fees to be paid before the start of the match season. All teams must use the Revelation Pro ball (double spot). The use of alternative speed balls is allowed if agreed in advance.
- (d) Players' clothing must comply with the England Squash Byelaws.
- (e) If it is considered that a condition exists on one or both courts which makes play hazardous or which may damage the court(s) the captains may elect to postpone the match in which case the entire match must be replayed and a report must be submitted to the League Secretary by both captains within seven days.

3. FIXTURES

- (a) Each team will play each of the other teams in their division once at home and once away, unless the division is 7 teams or less then teams will play home and away in each half .
- (b) The provisional fixture list must be confirmed online by club administrators by **23:59 on the 27th August**. Amendments to this fixtures list must be agreed between clubs and sent to the league secretary by email. Matches should normally be rearranged in the week allocated. Premier Division matches must be played on a Monday or a Tuesday (unless otherwise agreed by both clubs) and strictly within the week allocated.
- (c) Each Club Administrator must submit to the League Secretary (preferably by e-mail), any changes to the Provisional Fixture List **by 23.59 on the 27th August**. Amendments will be processed by the League Secretary. Teams affected by changes will be notified. The penalty for failing to observe this rule will be five points for the team seeking the change (maximum of one penalty per team).
Club Administrators must confirm their fixture List online by clicking the button (Click to confirm dates of fixtures) **by 23.59 on the 27th August**. The Provisional fixture will then be adopted. The penalty for failing to observe this rule will be 5 points per team per week or part week in default.
- (d) **Rearrangements of fixtures after 11th Sept.**
The re-arrangement of fixtures after this date may only be made with the PRIOR consent of the League Secretary. He/she must be e-mailed giving the reason for the change of date by the team seeking the change. Consent for change will only be given if exceptional circumstances exist. (I.e. Courts out of action, no electricity). A fixture cannot be changed due to player shortages or illness, no matter what the circumstances. One exceptional circumstance is where a club hosts a Super League match, the date of which is fixed after the season starts. In this event, at least 14 days notice of the change of fixture must be given or that club loses its right to have the fixture changed.
- (e) Matches will normally start at 1930, unless adopted on the fixture list.
- (f) All matches will consist of five ties, each being the best of five games. The rules of play shall be as laid down by the International Squash Rackets Federation.
- (g) Where a club has two or more teams in the same Division/Section all matches between those teams must be played before the last 4 matches of the season.
- (h) All matches must be played by the last day of the season.
- (I) Fixtures may be changed by the league secretary up until the fixture confirm date (rule3c) as fixtures are provisional until after this date.

For team' s wishing to drop out of the leagues before the fixture confirm date, the league secretary if necessary may move teams into another division and re run the fixtures in the necessary leagues. The teams that may be moved would be dependent on the previous year' s finishing positions.
For team' s that drop out of the leagues after this date will be withdrawn from the league. This means the team will be greyed out and moved to the bottom position of that league and would be one of the 2 relegated teams in that division.

4. TEAM COMPOSITION

- (a) Registration:

The registration/nomination of players is the responsibility of each Club Administrator.

- § All players must appear on their clubs Player Registration List (PRL), before they play. The PRL will define order of play through ability.
- § Each team must ' Confirm' on-line its PRL and declare its Nominated players by **23:59 on the 10th September**. Dispensation is granted to Exeter & Plymouth University due to their academic year. They must ' Confirm' on-line, their PRL before the Clubs (not team' s) first match of the season.

Failure to 'confirm' the PRL on time shall result in a 5-point deduction per team, per week, or part week overdue.

§ New players may be added to the PRL prior to 7.30pm on the night of a match or, if earlier, the published start time of a match (not tie).

§ Players who are un-registered or who play out of order shall forfeit both that and all lower ties.

§ Once confirmed, the players Rank Order can only be amended during the following 'windows'.

1st window 16th Oct – 22nd Oct. (window will have closed on the 23rd Oct.)

2nd window 25th Dec – 31st Dec. (window will have closed on the 1st Jan.)

3rd window 12th Feb – 18th Feb. (window will have closed on the 19th Feb.)

(b) Nominated Players:

§ Each team must nominate 5 players who must play at least 3 times in that half of the season for that team.

§ Should a nominated player not play 3 matches in a half season then 5 points shall be deducted from the team for each of the 3 matches not played.

§ Failure to 'Confirm' the nominated 5 players on-line before the **11th September** shall result in a 5-point penalty per week or part week thereafter.

§ No player may be nominated for more than one team.

§ Nominated players may not play for a team in a lower Division. Players in breach of this rule shall forfeit that and all lower ties.

§ A team can change its nominated players during the 2nd window.

§ A team may 'de-nominate' nominated players, in either the 1st or 3rd quarters of the season (the cut off date being the end of the 1st and 3rd windows), but the following conditions apply.

§ The League Secretary has to be informed by e-mail of any change. A new player must be nominated in place of the de-nominated player. This newly nominated player must play 3 times for that team in that half season, or face the penalty in 4(a) above. The matches this newly nominated player might already have played for the team in that half, shall count towards the 3.

§ A de-nominated player is not permitted to play Devon League squash for a team in a lower, or, a different team in the same division, in that half season.

(c) Any player becomes ineligible for a team as soon as that player has, in the current half season, represented the club on 3 occasions in any Division higher than that in which that team participates (E.g. a nominated Division 4 player who has played in that half once in Division 3 and twice in Division 2 is ineligible for Division 4). An ineligible player shall lose that tie and all lower ties.

(d) No player, nominated or not, having played for one team in a Division, may play for any other team in the same Division. A player in breach of this rule shall lose that tie and all lower ties.

(e) The temporary indisposition of a player does not justify movement to a lower position. Where a team has been found to have played out of order, that tie and all lower ties will be forfeit and five points deducted from the team concerned. The two captains must exchange the order of play prior to the start of the match. Failure to do so may invalidate any complaint about the order.

4(f) Infrequent player rule.

Before a team's last two matches of the season, the following condition must be met:

Each player must have already played two times for that team, or a lower team in the club, in the current season. If the condition can only be met by some players, then the remaining players **must** be chosen from players ranked lower on the registration list than those who do meet the condition. **All players must play in rank order.** If a player infringes this rule, that tie and all lower ties will be forfeit.

5. SCORES/ RESULTS

(a) Points will be awarded for each fixture on the basis of each game won plus five for the team winning the greater number of ties.

(b) Every League match must be refereed. The home team will supply referees for three of the ties and the away team two. Points may be deducted for failure to meet this rule.

(c) **A Match Card containing, the Division, date, venue, names of players and scores must be signed by both team captains and kept by the Home team, (Match Card can be downloaded from the Devon SRA website). A copy should be kept by the Away team.**

The Club Administrator or Captain from both the Home and Away teams are responsible for submitting on-line, a record of the match, or for verifying the result input by the opposing team. A Home team has 4 days

following a match, to input, or verify a result. The Away team has 7 days. In addition to this responsibility, where two teams from the same Club play each other, the signed Match Card (Not Photocopy) must be sent to the League Secretary for verification within 7 days. A team in breach of these rules will forfeit 3 points. In the event of a dispute over the score of a match, the League Secretary will request to see the signed Match Card which must be provided within seven days of being asked. Failure to comply with this rule will probably result in the forfeit of 3 points and may result in the withholding of points scored by the offending team.

(d) A club that wishes to give a walkover must inform the League Secretary. Failure to fulfil a fixture will result in the award of a walkover and the League Secretary must also be informed. The score cards must be confirmed online by both teams otherwise a 3 point penalty will be awarded for a late card. The names for the non-offending team are to be put in, then select string conceded for string 1 on the offending side, select the date and confirm. If the League Secretary awards a walkover, then the non-offending team will gain 20 points (or 14 points where both teams are from the same club) and the offending team will gain no points.

(e) League placing's will be decided by the number of points won or, where teams are level on points, by the number of matches won or, if still level, by the superior for and against points difference. Failing that, for first place only a play-off will be arranged.

(f) Two winning teams will normally be promoted and two bottom teams relegated at the end of the season, except where several sections feed into one, only one from each section will be promoted and an appropriate number relegated. Premiership winners will compete in the National Knock-out Competition. A team in default of this rule will render itself ineligible for Premiership of the Devon League for the following season. Other charges may be made at the discretion of the League Secretary.

(g) In the event of a team that has won promotion not wishing to exercise its right for reasons that are satisfactory to the committee the team that would have been relegated should have the right to remain up. In the event of the team to be relegated not wanting to stay up, the runners-up in the lower division shall be offered promotion.

6. IRREGULARITIES/ MISCONDUCT

(a) The Executive Committee has discretion in the event of a dispute or rule interruption. It has the power to award penalty by deduction of points in the event of irregularity, indiscipline or breach of the rules or take any action it sees fit.

(b) Failure by a club to give at least 48 hours notice of its intention not to fulfill a fixture will be considered a case for deduction of points. In any case, the postponing / canceling team must refund all out-of-pocket expenses which the other team actually incurred.

(c) Other than for exceptional reasons, if a team has two walkovers awarded against it, it will be suspended from the League and all matches previously played by it will be declared void.

(d) A club which withdraws teams following the final declaration of the Leagues for the next season (made after the D.S.R.A. A.G.M.) or whose team concedes two walkovers will have to reduce the number of teams it enters next season.

(e) At least three players from each team must be ready to play at the scheduled starting time. Any other players arriving late, must arrive before the last game has been finished (Unless a time has been agreed between Captain's). If not then they will be deemed not to have turned up. In that case or where a player fails to arrive at all, that player's tie and all lower ties will be forfeit.

If any player wishes to leave early then the opposing Captain must be contacted in advance of the match, if this is not possible then the player must stay until the last game has finished (if their game has not yet been played). If their opponent has not turned up then the above is imposed.

(f) In the event of a player being ineligible, that player's tie and all lower ties will be forfeit.

(g) If a tie is awarded against a player because of bad conduct, that player will be ineligible for the next League match of the team being represented at the time and may not represent any other team in the meantime. A report must be submitted to the League Secretary who may, under the procedure set out in the Devon Squash Rackets Association's Disciplinary Procedure, convene a Disciplinary Sub-committee to consider further action.

(h) All further disciplinary matters shall be dealt with in accordance with the Association's Disciplinary Procedure.

(I) Procedure for rule changes in the Devon League or Cup to be brought to the AGM:

Whoever wishes to change any current rules or who wish to introduce any new rules for the following season must follow this procedure.

1. Rule changes by players must be sanctioned by their club and to be sent through their club to the league secretary.
2. Rule changes must be sent in writing or by email and must reach the league Secretary by the first Monday in May.
3. The League Secretary will then take it to the Committee's May Meeting to be discussed and voted on.
4. If the committee vote for the rule change then it will go to the AGM.
5. If the committee votes against the rule change it will not go to the AGM. However it is the clubs right to raise an item to the Hon. Secretary to go to the AGM, this must be submitted to the Hon. Secretary not less than 14 days before the AGM.

DEVON SQUASH RACKETS ASSOCIATION DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE

1. The Devon SRA is, through its executive committee, the disciplinary authority for all squash played under its auspices. The DSRA is committed to administering discipline in accordance with the Rules of Squash and the England Squash Regulations and Code of Conduct.

2. The executive committee shall have a Disciplinary Sub-Committee to deal with all disciplinary matters. The executive committee shall appoint a Chairman of the Sub-Committee for each year and he shall serve as a member of the Executive Committee. The Chairman appointed shall be convener of the Sub-Committee and shall appoint a Secretary to each meeting from among the members present. Members of a Sub-Committee shall be drawn from the membership of the Executive Committee as agreed by the County Secretary and the Sub -Committee Chairman. A Sub-Committee shall have a maximum of five members for a meeting and a quorum of three members. The Chairman of the Executive Committee shall not serve upon a Disciplinary Sub - Committee.

3. (a) A complaint relating to misconduct or otherwise bringing the game into disrepute may be made by a referee, a captain or any other individual. The complaint must be made in writing to the League Secretary for League or Cup matters or otherwise to the County Secretary within seven days of the event. A complaint may be against an individual, individuals, a team or a club. (b) The League Secretary or County Secretary shall consult the Chairman of the Disciplinary Sub - Committee who shall decide whether the complaint warrants a formal disciplinary hearing.

4. A disciplinary Sub-Committee shall normally meet within 28 days of the receipt of a complaint, at a date, time and place convenient to it. Parties to a case shall be given 14 days notice in writing of the hearing and details of the allegations and issues involved.

5. The Sub - Committee Chairman may request written submissions from parties or witnesses to the incident. Submissions may also be made without prior request. Any written submission shall be with the Sub-Committee Chairman 5 clear days before the hearing. If a party be a team or club, it shall advise the Chairman of its nominated spokesperson 5 dear days before the hearing. A party may, with the agreement of the Chairman, call witnesses and a list of witnesses shall be given to the Chairman 5 dear days before the hearing. If the Chairman shall refuse to permit the appearance of any proposed witness, he shall report the fact and his reasons to the Sub -Committee. A party to a hearing, whether individual or representative, may be accompanied by an adviser or a friend, subject to the consent of the Chairman. The Sub - Committee may proceed to a hearing of a case despite the refusal of any party to appear before it.

6. At the hearing the procedure shall be as follows:

(a) The parties to the hearing shall be interviewed separately.

(b) No cross-examination of witnesses by parties to the hearing shall be permitted, but the Sub - Committee may ask questions of witnesses.

(c) The complainant shall be invited first to make an opening statement, call witnesses and draw attention to particular parts of written submissions. The Sub - Committee may question the complainant.

(d) The defendant shall next be invited to make an opening statement, call witnesses and draw attention to particular parts of written submissions. The Sub - Committee may question the defendant.

- (e) The complainant and the defendant shall each be invited to make, separately, a brief final statement.
- (f) The Sub-Committee may announce its decision immediately at the end of the hearing, or alternatively, it shall be announced by the Chairman in writing to the parties within 5 days. An oral announcement shall be confirmed similarly within 5 days.
- (g) The Chairman shall notify the decision to the Executive Committee.

7. An appeal against a Sub-Committee decision may be made by a party to a hearing in writing to the County Secretary within 7 days of the receipt of the decision.

8. (a) An appeal shall be heard by the Executive Committee either at a regular committee meeting, or a special meeting convened with the agreement of its Chairman.

(b) Pending the outcome of an appeal, the decision of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee shall be suspended.

(c) In addition to his formal report of the Sub-Committee decision, the Sub-Committee Chairman shall provide the Executive Committee with such further information or comment as the Executive Committee, through its Chairman or the County Secretary, may require.

(d) The appellant shall be invited to submit in writing the grounds of the appeal. The other party to the case shall also be invited to make a written submission. Submissions shall be provided to the County Secretary within 7 days of their being invited.

(e) The procedure for the hearing by the Executive Committee shall follow that specified for the Disciplinary Sub-Committee.

(f) The outcome of the appeal shall be advised to the parties by the County Secretary within 5 days of the hearing.

(g) The Executive Committee may upon an appeal confirm, reverse or otherwise modify a decision of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee. The Executive Committee may increase a penalty if it views an appeal as frivolous and vexatious or designed simply to suspend the decision of the Disciplinary Sub-Committee.

(h) The decision of the Executive Committee upon an appeal shall be final and without right of further appeal.

9. The Disciplinary Sub-Committee and the Executive Committee may take any award or penalty which they view as appropriate to the circumstances and nature of an offence and to the authority of the DSRA.

10. All final results of disciplinary proceedings shall be notified to England Squash by the County Secretary.

11. If civil or criminal proceedings are pending, reports and statements shall be collated as normal, but disciplinary proceedings by Devon SRA postponed until a decision has been reached by the criminal or civil authorities.

Devon Squash Ladies League Rules

2007-2008

The Devon Ladies Leagues were computerised last year. The intention is to provide an efficient and up to date league which provides more information than has ever been available before. It relies on the clubs to input the data and in so doing, reduces the previously impossible burden placed on the League Secretary. The League is hosted on the Discovery Software website www.discoverysoftware.co.uk and can be accessed via a link from the Devon SRA website www.devonsra.co.uk

Please ensure that you familiarise yourselves with the following rules which will be upheld **strictly**.

1. Eligibility

1.1 CLUBS

(a) All clubs/teams must be paid-up members of England Squash. Clubs/teams will be suspended if membership subscriptions are still outstanding on October 31st.

(b) League entry fees will be determined by the Executive Committee and notified to the Annual General Meeting. Entry fees are due on September 1st. Teams who have not paid by September 30th and any club not providing England Squash by that date with the total amount due for Individual Membership for all their Registered League team players, will have 5 points deducted for every match played before October 31st. Teams who have not paid by October 31st will be liable for suspension for the rest of the season, at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

(c) Any affiliated Club NOT represented at the Annual General Meeting will be charged an administrative levy of £10 which will be added to the invoice for the League team fees of that club. Non-attendance at the AGM will mean that the club representative cannot receive the League Secretary's pack of match balls, scorecards etc which are handed out at the AGM to all League clubs thereby saving postage and delivery costs.

(d) Clubs/teams must appoint a Club Administrator as a point of contact for the League Secretary. They must provide the League Secretary with their e-mail address. They will be responsible for representing the club/teams affairs and will have a password allocated by the League Secretary. It is therefore essential that passwords are not divulged to others. The Club Administrator may delegate to a Club Captain, the inputting and verification of result cards and the addition of players to the club/teams Player Registration List. Should an Administrator wish to delegate this authority, they must provide the League Secretary with the Club Captains name and e-mail address in order that they can be allocated a password. It is the Club Administrator who remains ultimately responsible for the actions of their Club Captains.

1.2 PLAYERS

(a) Players must be fully paid-up members of the club/ organisation they represent.

(b) Players must have:

(i) their principal place of residence in Devon or within 10 miles of the boundary

or (ii) have been born in Devon

or (iii) be qualified to represent Devon in the current season in the Inter County event.

(c) No player having been nominated for and having played without prior nomination in a mixed league match for one club/organisation, may in that season play for any other club/organisation in a mixed league match, unless cleared to do so by the League Secretary. Such clearance will be given only in exceptional circumstances.

(d) Where a player's eligibility is in doubt, proof of eligibility must be provided by the club/organisation to the satisfaction of the League Secretary.

England Squash Rules on Eye Protection at Junior Events

Since 1st September 2001, the wearing of suitable eye protection has been **MANDATORY** for all those taking part in the following **JUNIOR** events:

- 1, Events run by England Squash under the auspices of the World Squash Federation (WSF) and the European Squash Federation (ESF).
- 2, Events sanctioned by England Squash i.e. those tournaments paying a sanction fee to the England Squash.
- 3, Events run and managed by the England Squash, i.e. The British Junior Open National Championships and the National Schools Competition.
- 4, Grand Prix Events.
- 5, The Inter County Championships.
- 6, All County Closed Tournaments.
- 7, All County Tournaments open to players from other counties.
- 8, All County Squads
- 9, All National Squads.
- 10, All Regional Squads.

Since October 1997, it has been a **RULE** of the game of **DOUBLES** that eye protection **MUST** be worn on court whilst the game is taking place. **England Squash RECOMMENDS** that if you are playing doubles and neither your partner nor opponents are wearing 'suitable eye protection', then **YOU SHOULD NOT PLAY**.

SRA TECHNICAL INFORMATION SHEET NO. 14 EYE PROTECTION FOR SQUASH PLAYERS

The SRA recognizes that with the majority of sports there is the possibility of injury to a greater or lesser degree, subject to the nature of the sport.

The Rules of Squash are framed to assist in reducing the possibility of injury, but regrettably they do occur, of which the majority are of a minor category, bruises, sprains, etc. Of a more serious nature are torn ligaments, broken limbs and in particular, injury to the eyes. To assist in preventing the latter injury, the SRA considers it important that eye protectors that have been tested by National Standards Authorities are available to players of all ages who might wish to use them.

To meet this requirement the SRA, together with ophthalmic specialists, doctors, optical agencies and the British Standards Institution, undertook a considerable workload over a number of years to formulate the "British Standard for Eye Protectors for Racket Sports - Part 1 Squash", BS7930-1. This Standard was published in 1998 and since that date, numerous manufacturers have submitted their eye protectors for testing.

Details of the eye protectors that have met the British Standard are shown on the reverse, and new products are added when we are advised accordingly. The SRA maintain an updated list which is available on request.

A list of other eye protectors supplied from the U.S., Canada and Australia / New Zealand which hold the National Standard of their respective countries can be obtained from the World Squash Federation Tel: 01424 429245 fax: 01424 429250

Players are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that their eye protector has a recognized Standard - it is for your own safety.

The appropriate Standards for Eye Protection for Squash are listed below:

Should you have a query regarding an eye protector for squash or a Standard Number, please contact the SRA who will check the details for you.

Please be aware that a number of products advertised as eye protectors for squash and referencing a Standard totally unrelated to squash, are being offered for sale in the UK. These particular products are not proven suitable for squash.

The wearing of eye protectors for Doubles is mandatory, ref. Doubles Rules Appendix 10, effective 10.10.97. Eye protection is also mandatory for specified events for junior players (i.e. up to U/19 Level), please see attached list.

The SRA recommends the use of eye protection especially for beginners.

DEVON SQUASH and RACKETBALL **ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION**

1. Name.

The Association shall be called the Devon Squash and Racketball Association.

2. Objectives.

- i) The Association shall be the sole county authority for Devon in all matters relating to the organization and playing of the games of squash and racketball.
- ii) To promote and encourage the games of squash and racketball and to further their growth and development at all levels in the county.
- iii) To train, select and manage County teams for Inter County matches, arrange individual County Championships and other competitions as it shall from time to time deem necessary for fulfilment of objectives.

3.

The Association shall acquire on its inception the assets and liabilities at that time of the Devon Squash Rackets Association and the Devon Women's Squash Rackets Association.

4. Membership.

The Association consists of clubs and other organizations and individuals who are resident in Devon and are directly affiliated to or members of England Squash and Racketball and it may also introduce additional classes of membership under its own rules.

5.

The Association shall give equal consideration to the interests of men, women and junior players.

6. Management.

- i) The Association shall be directed and controlled by the Executive Committee.
- ii) The Executive Committee shall consist of a Chairman, Hon. Secretary, the Hon. Mixed League Secretary, the Hon. Ladies' League Secretary, the Hon. Assistant Secretary, the Hon. Treasurer and the Hon. Junior League Secretary who shall be its officers. The Committee shall also consist of a representative of each of the geographical regions of the Association in the North, East, South and West together with the Association's Coaching Organizer, the Association's Markers and Referees Organizer and the Association's Junior Organizer. The President of the Association shall be entitled to attend the meetings of the Executive Committee at his discretion.
- iii) Additional members may be co-opted by the Executive Committee as deemed appropriate.
- iv) A quorum for Management meetings shall be four members but must include at least one from the : Chairman/Secretary/Treasurer.
- v) The members of the Executive Committee shall be elected at each Annual General Meeting.
- vi) In the event of voting being equal for or against any motion before the Executive Committee the Chairman shall have a second and casting vote.

7. Powers of the Executive Committee.

- i) The Committee in meetings or by delegation to any of its officers shall have full power to manage and organize the Association's affairs in all matters relating to the Association and of its members as it shall deem fit in the best interests of the Association.
- ii) Without prejudice to the Executive Committee's responsibilities, the Committee shall have power to:
 - a) Employ the funds of the Association in such manner as it shall deem to be in the best interests of the Association.
 - b) Decide all questions not provided in this Constitution with regard to the games in Devon.
 - c) Fill any vacancy in their number and co-opt others.
 - d) Create such Sub-Committees as it shall be necessary to run the affairs of the Association, co-opting members as necessary.
 - e) Nominate a person to represent the Association on such National Committees as require representation from Devon.
 - f) Decide all questions between all affiliated organizations which may be sent to it for a decision.

8. Annual General Meeting.

The following regulations shall govern the holding of the Association's Annual General Meeting.

- i) The Association shall hold an Annual General Meeting, once in every calendar year and not more than 15 months after the preceding one. Not less than 21 days' notice of such a meeting shall be given and not less than 7 days' before the meeting a copy of the Agenda, Annual Report and Annual Accounts shall be forwarded to each club or organization or person eligible to vote at that meeting.
- ii) Nominations for any office shall be both proposed by and seconded by persons, clubs or organizations eligible to vote at such meetings and shall be made in writing to the Secretary, giving not less than 14 days' notice.
- iii) The following business shall be transacted:
 - a) Approval of the minutes of the previous meeting and consideration of any matters arising.
 - b) Approval of the Annual Report and the Annual Accounts.
 - c) A report of the Secretary.
 - d) Election of Officers and Committee.
 - e) Election of Auditors.
 - f) Any other business of which not less than 14 days' notice has been given.
 - g) Any other business which the Chairman may consider suitable for discussion.
- iv) The Annual General Meeting shall also elect a President, Vice Presidents and Life Vice Presidents.
- v) The time and place of the Annual General Meeting shall be fixed by the Executive Committee. Each member of the Executive Committee, the President and the Vice Presidents shall have one vote. Each constituent club shall have one vote.
- vi) The Chairman of the meeting shall be the President or failing that the Chairman of the Executive Committee or failing that one of the Vice Presidents.
- vii) The Chairman shall have an additional vote in the event of equal voting.

- viii) Only those present at the meeting shall be eligible to vote.
- ix) Individual members of the Devon Squash and Racketball Association are not entitled to vote at an Annual General Meeting.
- x) A quorum shall be three officers or members of the Executive Committee and six representatives of clubs or other organizations.

9. Auditor.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Association, among the officers to be elected and who shall not be a member of the Executive Committee is an auditor for the ensuing year. The Association may appoint more than one person to act as Honorary Auditor.

10. Extraordinary General Meeting.

An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Association may be convened in the following manner:-

- i) The Committee may do so whenever it thinks fit.
- ii) By the Secretary on receipt of a request in writing signed by the representatives of not less than 8 clubs or persons entitled to vote at an Annual or Extraordinary General Meeting. Any such meeting shall be held within 28 days, with 14 days' notice being given to those entitled to attend.

The rules regarding the eligibility of voting and the composition of a quorum shall be the same as for an Annual General Meeting.

11. Indemnity.

Officers and officials of County Squash and Racketball Associations are indemnified to a maximum of £1m against legal liability and claims for costs/expenses arising from injury or death to participants occurring during County events or activities at which they are officiating.

12. Alteration of Rules.

No addition, alteration or amendment to these rules shall be effected unless sanctioned by more than one half of those entitled to vote. For the purposes of amendment to the rules, proxies shall be permitted.
